Readings:

Revelations	11: 19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab
Psalm	45:10, 11, 12, 16
1 Corinthians	15:20-27
Luke	1: 39-56

Reflection:

Today's readings can be very confusing. The first one sounds like something out of a science fiction movie with a woman clothed in the sun with stars on her crown. She is having a baby but there is an evil dragon waiting to eat the baby. The second reading talks about heaven and the end of the world when Jesus destroys all of his enemies. Finally, in the Gospel, we hear about Mary visiting her cousin Elizabeth. Wow! How do you put all of these together to figure out what God is telling us today? If we think about the special event that we are celebrating, it will help us figure it out. Today we celebrate when God brought Mary to heaven before she died. She is the only person that has been given this gift, ever. God was so grateful for everything that Mary had done for all of us that He did this very special thing for her. Mary was a very young girl when she agreed to have Jesus. She was not married. It had to have been very frightening for her, maybe as scary as encountering a dragon! Even though she was afraid, she still trusted in God and did what was asked of her. Once Jesus was born, she had to watch him be criticized, hated, hurt, and killed. She endured all of this so that Jesus could show us how much God loves us. Because she helped show us God's love, we love her and honor her. We know how special she is to God, so we also pray to her, asking her to help us and to ask God to help us.

Discussion:

- How do you think Mary felt when people were mean to her because she was pregnant? (maybe this is why she needed to see her cousin, Elizabeth, someone who would understand and be happy with her)
- How do you think Mary can help us now?

Activity: Paper Flowers for Mary (Directions can also be found on the internet by searching "Paper Flowers").

Materials: Tissue paper (or the kind you use to blow your nose), floral wire, scissors.

Optional: Floral tape, rose perfume

Activity:

1. Take several pieces of tissue stacked upon each other. Fan-fold it back and forth, about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, until it is completely folded.
2. Once you have the tissue folded into what looks like a long strip, fold the strip in half, matching the two short ends.
3. Take a 12 inch piece of wire and tightly twist it around the center of the strip.
4. Cut the folded end. You can also cut a design in each end.
5. Peel the layers up, one layer at a time, opening the flower.
6. If you like, wrap the wire with floral tape and mist with perfume.

If your Pastor will allow it, have the class place their flowers by the Mary statue in Church when they process back in before returning to their parents. If not, ask the class to do so after Mass is over. If there is extra time, the class may also make a flower for their mothers.
