## **SECOND READING**

**J**esus told his disciples this story about the kingdom of heaven:

“The kingdom of heaven is like what happened one night  
when ten girls took their oil lamps  
and went to a wedding to meet the groom.

Five of the girls were foolish and five were wise.

The foolish ones took their lamps, but no extra oil.

The ones who were wise took along extra oil for their lamps.”

“The groom was late arriving,  
and the girls became drowsy and fell asleep.

Then in the middle of the night someone shouted,  
‘Here’s the groom! Come to meet him!’”

“When the girls got up and started getting their lamps ready,

## Thirty-Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

### Reflection:

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us another story. It is about 10 bridesmaids who are waiting for the bridegroom to come for the wedding but they didn't know when he was going to get there. Five of the maids were very smart. They brought extra oil for their lamps (kind of like having extra batteries for your flashlight) so when he finally showed-up, they were ready and could go to the wedding banquet with him. The other 5 maids were foolish. They did not bring extra oil so when the bridegroom arrived their lamps were not working. They ran to buy more oil but while they were gone the wedding party went into the banquet and locked the doors so when the 5 foolish maids returned they could not go to the party.

This story is about us and God. We are the bridesmaids. Jesus is the bridegroom and the wedding banquet is heaven. Jesus is telling us that we need to be prepared for God as the 5 smart bridesmaids were. If we are not prepared then we will not be able to attend the banquet in heaven.

Being prepared means being ready for something even if you don't know for sure when it's going to happen. For example, Moms and Dads keep band-aids in their purses and wallet's so they are prepared when someone gets hurt. Kids do their homework so they are prepared for school the next day. In our house, the mornings go much smoother if everyone puts-out their clothes for the next day, packs their lunch and their backpacks and gets to bed on time. When this happens everything is great the next morning, calm and smooth but when we are not prepared the mornings are a mess and everyone ends up cranky.

Being prepared for the heavenly banquet means being ready to meet Jesus and to go to heaven at any time.

### Discussion:

1. What kind of people, do we believe, go to heaven?
2. What are some things we can do to be like those people and prepare ourselves to meet God?

**Activity:**

Materials needed: A battery operated candle or a small flashlight. A recording of *This Little Light of Mine*. You could also simply sing the song and say, "Stop," at the appropriate times.

This activity is very similar to the game, *Hot Potato*. Place the children in a large circle. Ask them to pass the candle/flashlight around the circle until the music stops or you say, "Stop." Whoever is holding the candle says, "Jesus is coming soon and I'm going to get ready to meet Him by.....", then they complete the sentence in their own words. The music resumes playing and whoever is holding the candle when it stops takes the next turn. Continue until everyone has an opportunity to say what they are going to do.
