We can give the gift of God's love.
(Review Advent Activities Section)

Prayer: Dear God, we love you so much. We know you love us very much too because you sent, Jesus, to us! Jesus was born with your life and love and so are we. Help us to grow to be like Jesus—to be full of love. Thank you, God for loving us. AMEN.

Readings: Micah 5:1-4a; Hebrews 10:5-10; Luke 1:39-45

Reflection: Micah expresses joy that the Messiah will come from among the people of this little town of shepherds. Mary turns to her cousin Elizabeth for comfort and courage—not to her mother or the temple! Both these stories make it clear that God's ways are with the simple, humble and good people of the earth—not the powerful, rich or most popular. Why does our God, time and again, choose the ordinary to be the way of manifesting the Divine? Perhaps it says more about us being surprised and not realizing God is not about anything else!

Activities: We can give the gift of God's love. Review the process of coming to this Sunday: The signs of the coming of the Son of Man, John the Baptist, Mary and Elizabeth. Talk about all the ways the children have prepared for Jesus' birth. Then point out the significance of the angels, shepherds, creation, being sent away from the inn, as well as Mary, Joseph and Jesus' humble beginnings. Remind the children to be thankful for the presence of their loved ones even as much as they are appreciative of their presents.

To Conclude the Session: Remember: We say the same prayer because we are celebrating God's love for us, shown in a very special way in Jesus' birth and then in all of us!

Prayer: Dear God, we love you so much. We know you love us very much too because you sent, Jesus, to us! Jesus was born with your life and love and so are we. Help us to grow to be like Jesus—to be full of love. Thank you, God for loving us. AMEN.
