We can give the gift of God's love.
(Review Advent Activities Section)

Prayer: Dear Jesus, today we celebrate REJOICE Sunday. We sing with joy to God, for sending us Jesus to show us how to love and to live with hope for justice for all your people. Please help us to be your light and love to all those who need hope and love these days. Amen.

Readings: Zephaniah 3:14-18a; Philippians 4:4-7; Luke 3:10-18

Reflection: The readings express joy, hope and gratitude for God's Presence in the world. St Paul tells us we should rejoice always because the Lord is near. John the Baptist really puts the burden of discipleship right back on to those who ask: "What shall we do?" John does exactly what Jesus would do: Tells each person to honestly and simply go the good you can! Sister Dianne Bergant, CSA, a Scripture scholar said, in relation to this Scripture: "We cannot fail to wonder how much of the world's sorry state is not the consequence of arrogance—arrogance stemming from military prowess, or economic prosperity, or educational superiority.... It is precisely in and through our efforts to rid our world of such [arrogance] that the new world is fashioned, the reign of God brought forth."

Activities: Ask the children to talk about how we know God is present in our world. Talk a little bit about how we can help God in establishing peace and changing people's attitude toward the poor and underserved of the world. Share about how we might respond to John the Baptist's challenge: What can we do? (Also, see Activities, #3, for next Sunday—especially if you will not be meeting next week. REVIEW NEXT SUNDAY'S Activities in case you'd rather incorporate them this week.)

To Conclude the Session: Remind the children, that God doesn't just ask us to pray for the poor, sick, and unjustly treated people of the world: God expects us to do what we can! Big or small.
