FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Cycle C

Prayer: Dear God, We know you help us to do good things. Help us to see and understand your love in new and better ways every day. Thank you for your love and forgiveness. We love you. Amen.

Readings: Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19; Ps 71:1-6, 15, 17; 1 Cor 12: 31-13:13; Luke 4:21-30

Reflection: Jesus always spoke the truth even if it didn't make others like him. The gospel begins with the line that ended last Sunday's gospel: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." The stories Jesus retells show us that many times in history people believe they know what is best, right and true and no one is going to convince them otherwise. Jesus clearly says to the religious people listening to him: You have it all wrong. You have to think differently. You don't have it all figured out! They just couldn't take it. In fact, the story says clearly, they were so upset they couldn't even stay focused enough to move Jesus to the edge of the hill to hurl him down. Doesn't that sound like the raucous after a losing football game and everyone goes so crazy they don't even know what they are doing!!?? Well, that's what happens here. Jesus reminds us again that he came to bring the Gift of Love not just to live into our expectations.

Activities:

As we read the list of love's characteristics, we realize just how simple and yet challenging love is. Our society does not always reward us when we are patient, or even kind. In fact, it regularly says: Watch out for Number One; Don't be taken advantage of; etc. By making icons of movie stars, sports heroes and musical artists, we see their power and fame as more often praised and sought after than love, care and truth.

If we stop for a moment and reflect, we might discover that the people we really admire the most are those who are indeed patient and kind. The ones who make our days and nights more safe and enjoyable not by doing big things but by doing simple things in a big way. They are people who genuinely love, people after whom we might want to model ourselves, people who have discovered the "more excellent way." You might use a newspaper, bulletin, Diocesan Paper or magazine to find stories that show ordinary people doing loving deeds.



To Conclude the Session: Print a copy (or copies) of the list on the following page large enough for each child to see.

Have each child complete at least one phrase. This can be done verbally. Pray together: God is Love and when we love, we are being like God.
